## Radiation Characteristics

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International Rectifier Radiation Hardened MOSFETs are tested to verify their radiation hardness capability. The hardness assurance program at International Rectifier is comprised of two radiation environments. Every manufacturing lot is tested for total ionizing dose (per notes 5 and 6) using the TO-3 package. Both pre- and post-irradiation performance are tested and specified using the same drive circuitry and test conditions in order to provide a direct comparison.






**Fig a.** Single Event Effect, Safe Operating Area






**Fig 1.** Typical Output Characteristics



**Fig 2.** Typical Output Characteristics




**Fig 3.** Typical Transfer Characteristics




**Fig 4.** Normalized On-Resistance Vs. Temperature




**Fig 5.** Typical Capacitance Vs.  
Drain-to-Source Voltage


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
**Fig 6.** Typical Gate Charge Vs.  
Gate-to-Source Voltage




**Fig 7.** Typical Source-Drain Diode  
Forward Voltage




**Fig 8.** Maximum Safe Operating Area




**Fig 9.** Maximum Drain Current Vs.

**Fig 10a.** Switching Time Test Circuit




**Fig 10b.** Switching Time Waveforms




**Fig 11.** Maximum Effective Transient Thermal Impedance, Junction-to-Case




**Fig 12a.** Unclamped Inductive Test Circuit




**Fig 12b.** Unclamped Inductive Waveforms

**Fig 13b.** Gate Charge Test Circuit


